

Includes a chapter on pre-trial applications and the process and rules for serving and filing them in court.	Includes a chapter on pre-trial applications, with discussion of drafting, timing, service, and filing.
Each chapter includes suggestions and recommendations for paralegals, and review questions and exercises for individual or group discussion.	Each chapter includes practice tips for paralegals, discussion questions, cases in point (summary of a case that relates to the particular legal issue being discussed), and examples of hypothetical cases to illustrate legal principles.
Includes a chapter on common office procedures (Chapter.24) that addresses business communications, billing, retainer agreements, and how to provide legal aid.	Not included.
